



Domaine A Pinot Noir 2013

It's a classic—the consummate Tasmanian pinot noir. Bright in the glass, the hue is reminiscent of port wine jelly and mulberry, with aromatics of Christmas pudding, black cherry and port-soaked raisins, as well as violet and lilac. The palate is velvety and silken soft with beautifully integrated tannins, structure and impressive acidity providing backbone. Notes of star anise, plum, cranberry and a touch of menthol unite to create an almost blackcurrant pastille-like flavour, and lead to a subtle dark chocolate finish. This is a warming, winter pinot and will pair brilliantly with grilled mushrooms, marinated pork or duck à l'orange.

Moorilla Cloth Label Late Disgorged 2007

Ten years on lees, eighteen months under cork. Patience, technique, fruit and oak all work in perfect harmony here, giving an intense, complex sparkling that balances the full complexity of our northern fruit with commitment to process and maturation. Sweet nougat and toasted brioche compliment a savoury, almost salty minerality across the mid-palate, while the silken creaminess of the mouthfeel and a fruit-driven brightness balance from nose to finish. Luxurious and hugely rewarding.

Moorilla Muse Extra Brut Sparkling 2014

A toasting wine if ever there was one. The nose brings plenty of oak influence, which recedes and integrates on the palate. A lively bead in the glass carries nicely into the mouth, retaining a nice ticklish fizz of crisp apple, white nectarine (softer, gentler and more refined than typical stonefruit notes), light almond, and a nice floral lily-hyacinth bouquet into the impressively long finish. Tuck some away for an occasion worth a speech and a tipple.

Moorilla Pinot Noir 2009

A special back vintage blended to show a balance of fruit-and-oak aromas and flavours. You can expect fresh berries and spice with hints of tobacco and leather. It's been patiently cellared for eleven years in bottle maturation, resulting in a silky smooth wine with hints of roasted plums and black cherry.

Stoney Vineyard Sauvignon Blanc 2018

Fresh, verdant and refreshing. Flickering yellow and green in the glass, our 2018 Sauvignon Blanc welcomes you with crunchy green salad aromas: cucumber, green capsicum and new asparagus. Then to the fruit pop palate of cantaloupe, honeydew and passionfruit. The fruit sweetness is balanced with pleasing acidity and intensity, and a satisfying medium finish.

Moorilla Muse Cabernet Sauvignon 2015

Rich, deep and dark-maroon to look at, with an intriguing, fruits-and-beasts-of-the-forest nose that runs the gamut from mahogany and sous-bois to dark chocolate-berry sponge cake and a slight, almost animalistic hint of musk, the 2015 Muse Cabernet Sauvignon is a thoroughly intriguing wine. On the palate, the tannins are dense and complex (promising a very long life), with lingering sour cherry, dried berries, and shades of cappucino (plenty of chocolate sprinkles) topped by a slightly-above-medium acidity. Pair it with something spicy in its youth or give it some time to open up in the cellar.
